## **Government Affairs**

For those of you working on Federal Projects:

On November 29, ASHRAE President Mick Schwedler wrote to Secretary Cardona of the U.S. Department of Education to request the department update the edition of the ASHRAE Energy Conservation Standard referenced in the Code of Federal Regulations governing direct grant programs carried out by the Department of Education (34 CFR § 75.616). The regulation currently references ASHRAE 90-1980, 90-1975, and 90-1977. The letter urges the Secretary to instead reference the latest standard published in 2019, ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2019, Energy Standard for Buildings Except for Low-Rise Residential Buildings. Compared to a building built using ASHRAE Standard 90.1-1985, a building built to ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2019 will use less than half the energy. Updating the standard referenced in the CFR to the 2019 version will support school facility improvements based on the latest and best information available. This change will also result in significantly reduced energy costs and environmental emissions.

This is just one example of ASHRAEs work with lawmakers and policy officials to keep the latest standards in building codes. The Grassroots efforts of ASHRAE start in the local chapters with each member. You DO make a difference!
