

Name of the course: "The Great Seismic Headache"

Description of Course:

The course is based on the International Building Code 2015 edition and the ASCE 7 standard 2010 edition. The course is designed to raise awareness of the potential risks associated with non-structural failures and the costly consequences associated with those failures. Attendees will be guided down a path to discover why restraint requirements exist, what are the restraint requirements, what happens when restraints are not properly designed and installed, and understand the key roles that each party on the design and installation team play in assuring compliance.

He is a past president of the Southern Piedmont Chapter of ASHRAE and also the Pinnacle award recipient for the 2002-2003 campaign years.
